

British Arab figures call for support of the "Arab Voice" and "The Muslim Vote" campaigns in coming elections

More than fifty prominent figures from the Arab community in Britain have signed an appeal to people of conscience to support the "Arab Voice" and "The Muslim Vote" campaigns in the coming general elections scheduled for July 4th, 2024.

The appeal calls for cooperation and unification of efforts to form an influential voice in the elections through a series of coordinated actions.

An appeal to the British Arab and Muslim communities

The signatories highlighted the importance of electing and supporting the candidate endorsed by the "Arab Voice" in coordination with the "The Muslim Vote" to ensure effective and impactful representation.

Key Points

1. **Elect and Support the Endorsed Candidate:** Candidates are chosen based on precise criteria that align with the goals of both campaigns. Voters can find the endorsed candidate through the link mentioned above.
2. **Immediate Withdrawal of Non-Endorsed Candidates:** All other candidates who are not endorsed by the campaigns, yet standing on similar pledges, are urged to withdraw immediately in favor of the endorsed candidates, so to avoid splitting the vote and ensuring an easy win for the incumbents or the major parties candidates.
3. **Support Electoral Campaigns:** All voters are encouraged to support and promote the electoral campaigns of endorsed candidates, while also urging friends and colleagues in the respective constituency to vote accordingly.
4. **The Right to Vote:** Emphasis on the importance of exercising the right to vote, either in person or through other methods allowed by British Electoral law.
5. **Reject Abstentions:** Warning that not exercising the right to vote indirectly supports the worst candidate standing.

Local and International Issues

The appeal noted that prioritising the cessation of genocide in Gaza does not necessarily mean neglecting local issues.

The campaign has considered all issues before endorsing any candidate to ensure a balance between international and local issues.
